

### **Annual Report- 2019: According to the Criteria Specified by the NAAC**

#### **1. CURRICULAR ASPECTS**

The academic curriculum of undergraduate and postgraduate courses has been prepared and governed by the Patna University administration and is delivered through improved introspection and sustained implementation of the academic planning and delivery over a period of time.

At the college, curriculum is translated into action through classroom teaching, digital teaching, assignments, group discussions, seminars, workshops etc. The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process which relevance to the regional / national / global development needs with well-defined and informed learning objectives and outcomes. Effective curriculum implementation has been ensured through proper infrastructure in terms of the smart classrooms, conventional classrooms, labs which are equipped with high-end instruments and are in tune with the current need of modern age. This resulted in enhancement of skill-set and the learning ability



of the students. The development of soft skill, communication skill, writing skill and presentation skill through Language Lab and overall personality development are part of curricula.

The MMC has several academic flexibilities in all programs. The university has not introduced choice Based Credit System (CBCS) till now in the undergraduate conventional courses. It has only been implemented in postgraduate courses in the Academic Session 2018-19. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is implemented in self-financing courses of BCA, BBA and BSW in the Academic Session 2019-20. Academic Calendar and teaching modules are framed by the university and executed by the college to ensure that classroom lectures are of high quality and meet the time schedule.

To compete with the technological demands of the modern era, faculty members have been insisted to follow innovative pedagogy of teaching methods, like internet, e-notes, and LCD projectors apart from chalk and talk. Use of ICT in classroom takes students to an educational world beyond the syllabus. smart classrooms, virtual classrooms, interactive sessions with subject experts, play an important role in curriculum delivery.

The curriculum is revised on the basis of feedback system. Some senior faculty members of the college are the member of Moderation Board and Board of Courses and Studies and they play significant role in curriculum designing and revision. Feedback on curriculum is obtained from the various stakeholders, is analyzed by the university authorities and the required changes are informed to the concerned authorities to ensure the holistic development of the students. The qualitative education is manifested by the performance of the students who become rank holders at the University Examinations.

The MMC has valid and reliable plan of assessment for the development of students based upon the active participation and the actual achievements of goal marks defined as per institutional curriculum goals. To familiarize new and prospective stakeholders about the mission and vision of the college, a prominent hoarding is placed at the very entrance to the college main gate to greet them on the arrival. The vision and mission of the college is to fulfill what it has envisaged by providing quality education, which will enable students to become educated responsible citizen and realize their position in society as an independent empowered woman.

Enrichment of the curriculum engages beyond the classroom to innovative teaching practices and offers opportunities to the students to express their views and improve their skill. Various students' activities are organized to promote general communication skill and encourage them towards independent broad thinking. Skill development programmes such as essay competitions, debates, group discussions, extempore, quiz competitions are organized by the departments regularly.

Students' oriented methods like preparation of project reports, power point presentation, group discussion, experiential learning, paper presentation, seminars, workshops, assignments, tutorials and other aids to promote general communication skill among students and also help to apply new teaching techniques in faculty members. Study tours, field visits,





community services, outreach programmes, extension activities, encourage initiatives, independence and collaborative learning among students. The multi -dimensional enthusiastic performance of the students in all aspects and ranks obtained by the Institution at the University Examinations are exemplary for the quality education of the institution.

Patna University publishes its academic calendar every year and college strictly adhere to it. The college carries out effective planning to stick to academic calendar and ensure effective time management. This allows both teachers and students to space out their teaching and learning. The new session of undergraduate program in the college commences in the month of July every year. The university examinations of undergraduate courses begin from the month of February (Honours Part III), March (Honours Part II) and April (Honours Part I) followed by Practical Examinations and Viva-Voce Examination. University examinations of all conventional and vocational courses end in the month of May before the summer vacation. However, sent-up examinations are carried out on the pattern of final examination. After the assessment of the sent-up examination papers, students are being given feedback about their performance, strengths, and weaknesses with their areas for improvement.

Similarly, for postgraduate examination, students are explained and made aware about academic calendar and evaluation process of Continues Internal Assessment (CIA-PG Exams comes under this) during their orientation session at the beginning of each semester. The entire details are also displayed on the departmental notice board. The assessment tools viz class tests, assignments, presentations are well explained and demonstrated to them during Induction -cum- Orientation Programme and practice at regular interval to motivate them for outstanding performance.

The Institution follows decentralized administration to a considerable extent. Regular meetings are conducted with the academic staff by Principal. The suggestions and opinions of the staff members are considered regarding the qualitative betterment of curricular aspects. HoD's are delegated with the academic and administrative work. The departmental meetings are conducted by the HoD's with the teaching staff focusing on improving the academics, co-curricular and extracurricular activities. Various works are imparted to the faculty members like time-table, teaching plans, lesson plans, course material, work diary, which is reviewed by the HoD 's at monthly departmental council meeting. In addition to the academic responsibility shouldered, fulltime teaching staff also takes up administrative work and are on the functional committees that cover all aspects of governance of the college.

An academic audit committee has been constituted by the Principal to review the academic process and progress of all programmes. The audit committee members are nominated from the various departments of college. The audit committee will conduct academic audit periodically with prior intimation to assess the academic process and submit the report to the Principal. Based on the suggestions given by the academic audit committee members, corrective action is taken by the Principal. Teaching- learning process is further improved by academic audit and effective corrective measures taken by the Principal. Based on the observations and recommendations made by the committee the Heads of the various departments are asked to take necessary corrective measures to improve the academic and administrative performances.

## 2. TEACHING-LEARNING AND EVALUATION

The MMC is dedicated to make teaching - learning more effective for the students to think and analyse critically to be creative. Student centric teaching methods are adopted for effective communication of the subject knowledge to the students. Students are taught with the mission that fosters a learning environment which nurtures exploration of various skill and critical thinking about the subject. This presents new opportunities for academics in strengthening the courses under arts, science, commerce and all vocational.

The enrolment process of the Institution is fully transparent and follows the guidelines of Patna University including the Reservation Policy of Central Govt. and Govt. of Bihar. Students from different community backgrounds have been enrolled in every academic session. Students are trained and prepared to face challenges of modern era through value-based education system.

The era of 21<sup>st</sup> Century is described as 'Knowledge Century and is an Era of e-learning'. As per the need of global scenario, the institution has provided ICT equipments in order to make Teaching-Learning more effective and informative. Chalk and Talk method are supplemented by ICT equipment, which is an innovative approach.

Teaching-learning process is supported by adequate infrastructural provisions in the premises. The hallmark of the institution is excelling workforce. The college is proud to have a strong team of 49 well-qualified permanent faculty members, adequate number of ad-hoc teachers and experienced guest faculty who give their time to make the college a new avenue of quality teaching-learning and research work. Four new Assistant Professors have joined in the year 2019.

Teaching plan is framed in accordance to the availability of number of working days in each academic session / semester based on proposed academic calendar. The plan includes internal tests, assessment of students' abilities and teaching methods and other teaching related students' performance enhancing activities.

Our college has adopted many innovative methods of teaching for undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. The departments assess the learning level of students during introductory session and organizes special programmes for advanced and slow learners. Students are assessed through personal interactions in introductory sessions. The faculty members of the department try to gather the maximum information about newly admitted students. It includes marks obtained by them in the last qualifying examination, educational background, information about the school they last attended, discipline, and about the subject knowledge and interest. A general academic background of all admitted students is obtained by the departments and necessary steps taken for slow and advance learners.

During the first fifteen days of the new academic session, basic concept of their respective subjects is discussed in the form of **Bridge Courses**, so that beginners have an initial idea of the same. Syllabus along with concerned Text and Reference books are discussed in the classroom teaching and according to syllabus topic-wise specification of books are made available to them. They are also taught to differentiate between Textbooks and Reference books. Efforts are made to familiarize them with the library and also to enhance their habit to visit the library regularly.



Mentoring Programmes and Career Counselling Programmes are used for identifying learning needs of students and helping them accordingly. Guidance and solution of previous question papers of university examinations are provided. Students are motivated to participate in various projects and scholarship schemes and are encouraged to participate in seminars and workshops for all round personality development.

All most all department conducts Remedial Classes and Enrichment Classes for slow and advance learners. The sole object of education is to enable students to prepare themselves to face the challenges of global scenario. The college has organized industrial visit, internship programmes and various orientation programmes to enhance learning experience of students. The Institution has hosted university level competitions like- inter-college, inter-university sports competition, cultural competition, fine arts competition, and management fest to develop and improve the leadership qualities and academic knowledge of students.

The Institution has regularly provided a broad range of services including individual and collective development of slow learners and advance learners as well as workshops and talks of field experts. In addition to these, the college provides a range of programmes to promote mental health, emotional resilience and wellness throughout the campus - community. The Counsellors and Resource Persons interact with students during orientation session, conduct sensitization programmes and theme focused short term group sessions in the departments.

Different teaching strategies are adopted by the faculty in the classroom to cater the diverse needs of the learners. Tutorials are organized to solve their curiosity and other problems. Medium of the learners is taken care of, by providing reading material in Hindi and English languages in the library. A culture of cooperation is promoted, where peer tutoring is made use of, especially for the visually and physically challenged learners admitted in the college.

All the teacher follows student centred approach, while imparting content in the classroom where they act as facilitators and guides, and encourage students to contribute to the body of knowledge. Students are also provided with teaching- learning support in the form of handouts, reading material etc. Furthermore, participatory learning activities are adopted by the faculty contributing to self-management of the knowledge by the students viz. discussion methods, heuristic method, problem solving, brain storming, assignments with their presentations, role plays, etc. Learners are also encouraged and given opportunity to search the library and the websites for self-learning purpose.

Teachers verbally address the course outcomes to students during classroom teaching. Feedback mechanism is the key of all academic development. It enables student to acknowledge the academic value of the education. Therefore, it becomes the moral responsibility of faculty members to understand and communicate the programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes and course outcomes to the students.

Assessment of performances is an integral part of teaching and learning process. Class Tests and Terminal Examinations are conducted properly. Sent up Examination is conducted on the pattern of final examination to prepare the students for final examination. This includes both practical and viva-



voce examinations. CCTV cameras are installed in all classrooms to ensure malpractice free examination. Result of these examinations are displayed on departmental notice board and discussed with the parents in departmental Parent-Teacher Meetings. Students securing highest marks in class tests and sent up examination and the highest attendance percentage are felicitated by the college on the occasion of College Annual Day and College Foundation Day.

MMC encourages the students for participation through project work, in-plant training, attending seminars and workshop in recent technologies. Students are provided both central library with Wi-Fi connectivity and department library for referring to latest collection of journals. The academic progress of the students is continuously monitored by the continuous performance assessment in theory and practical tests. The students are motivated and mentored by the faculty members. Based on the performance of the students, they are trained to participate in workshops, seminars and paper presentations. The learners are encouraged to adopt information technology to transact in the classrooms e.g. power point presentations. ICT based assignments; projects are given to students.

Experience sharing is encouraged with a view to improve the quality of teaching. During the meetings of college committees, experiences of the faculty members who attend national and international seminars and events are shared amongst the faculty. At times workshops, separate special, discussion sessions, etc., arranged with this objective. A series of seminars, workshops and such other academic events are organized by the Institution every year to provide opportunities for intellectual stimulation and to provide platforms to share knowledge, skill and expertise.

Co-curricular and extracurricular activities promote not only personal effectiveness of students but also their professional success. The faculty constantly motivates the students to participate in extracurricular activities by indicating its positive impact on one's resume and job prospects. The faculty reiterates the fringe benefits of participation in extracurricular activities, that include skill development, social skill, confidence building, inter personal skill, public speaking, team spirit etc. to the students. Sometimes parent-teacher meetings are used as a forum to address the reluctant parents to convince them of the significance of extracurricular activities for integrated development of their wards.

The IQAC plays a pivotal role in continuous monitoring the teaching-learning process, facilitating regular engagement in academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities by the departments and various bodies of the college. The IQAC members analyzing the inputs from feedback system and using the suggestions for holistic improvement of students as well as Institution. Importance of learning outcomes is also communicated to faculty members in IQAC meetings. The feedback of lecture delivery of teachers is also communicated to IQAC members in the IQAC meetings. Students' suggestions are actively entertained. Meetings of departmental council are conducted on monthly basis to review and assess the completion of syllabus, results and overall development of students.

The mission of all programs is to promote the academic quality of students, to improve their quality of life and create a learning environment that facilitates their individual development.

### 3. RESEARCH, INNOVATIONS AND EXTENSION

Research is assumed to be the bone marrow of any progressive institution. The college has exhilaration to encourage in-house Research Projects; the faculty members have been given opportunity to run inter-disciplinary Research Projects through institutional funding and others.

Many of faculty members are playing the role of supervisor of CPE Research Projects. A sizeable number of undergraduate and postgraduate students of the college undertake Short-Term Research Projects on various point of interest related to current and relevant issues under the CPE Scheme of UGC. The grant is sanctioned by UGC for improving the infrastructure and promoting the students of all departments towards research work. All research programmes are initiated and completed on the basis of CPE Scheme Guidelines. This is a team inclusive venture where the college actively involves students to perform research under CPE scheme in different subjects, which orients them towards uplifting their research and scientific knowledge and acumen.

Primarily an undergraduate institution with only six postgraduate departments the college has nevertheless been a centre of active research. Every science department has two research laboratories. Department of Chemistry has an innovative Physical Research Laboratory sponsored by Govt. of Bihar since 2012, which contains valuable equipments.

The college level research workshops are specially organized for undergraduate and postgraduate students to enhance their research abilities. Presentation on research topics and tools of data collection also contribute in this direction. A Research Resources Committee has been constituted to encourage faculty members DST, to prepare research proposals to be sent to UGC, ICSSR, TISS, UNICEF etc. Faculty members are also encouraged to prepare seminars and workshops proposal, and proposals to set up new field action projects, etc. Many faculty members have completed Minor/ Major Research Projects. At present the college has two running research projects., one from UGC and one from ICSSR, New Delhi.

The college administration motivates the faculty members to engage themselves in research activities and has been giving priority for research and consultancy activities. The college has received various UGC/ ICSSR/ DST/ UNICEF/ TISS grants for Major/Minor Research Projects which are very beneficial for society and humanity. A number of faculty members of different departments are guiding Ph.D. scholars in their respective departments.

Apart from the above project many of faculty members have published Research Papers in different reputed National / International Journals and in UGC notified list of journals also. A good number of teachers participated in Orientation Programmes, Refresher Course, Workshops and Seminars. The college has conducted number of national / state levels seminars and workshops during this period. Overall faculty members of the college have attended seminars and conferences of



national/international level and presented papers in seminars organized by different Institutions/ Organizations.

The faculty members of the college are providing informal consultancy free of cost. Several extension activities are conducted through NSS and NCC units of the college in collaborations with Red Cross Society, Government Departments, NGOs and Corporate Houses. Educational Tour, Blood Donation Camps, Plantation Drive, Sanitation Drive, Health Check-up Camps, Awareness Programmes, Outreach Programmes, Community Services, Environment Sustainability Programmes, Industry Visit, Field Work Surveys etc. are the prominent extension activities conducted regularly round the year. The students are actively involved in blood donation camp, slum areas visit, community services and thereby helping to save the lives of the needy.

**Community Engagement:** The Institution has a rich tradition of initiating various field action projects thereby involving itself in community engagements. At present the Institution is engaged in some field action projects under the aegis of NSS and NCC units of the college. In addition, the Institution also organizes village camps, slum area services and a variety of programmes for creating community awareness in society on various issues.

It has launched several field actions projects in the context of child rights, women's rights, girls' education, gender sensitization, human values, HIV/AIDS, environment and sustainability etc. primarily to address to the needs of the society, provide practice opportunities to faculty and also to provide field training facilities to its students. These projects also reflect the institution's traditions, value orientations, and vision for the future. Community related research work keeps the Institution involved in community engagements.

Through NSS and NCC units, the college is extensively working for the welfare of the society and sensitizing students for the same. College students attended Army Camp, Combined Annual Training Camp, IGBC, Pre RDC, Special National Integration Camp (SNIC). Pre TSC-Advance Leadership Camp, Rock Climbing and Trekking Camp, Thal - Sainik Camp, SSB Course Camp, Youth Exchange Program, All India Cancer Awareness Programmes, Ozone Day, International Yoga Day and Self-defence Training Programmes to strengthen the capability of young women in society. They received different awards under various categories of events.

The students also participate in various awareness programmes organized in the premises like HIV/AIDS (Bihar State HIV/AIDS Control Society), making human chain on various social issues, cleanliness drive, literacy drive, flood relief drive and blood donation drive in collaborations with different government and non-governmental organizations.

Round the year several cultural, co-curricular, extracurricular activities have been organized under the aegis of House System and Students' Central Society and sports activities under the aegis of Athletic Society of the college on different occasions.

#### 4. INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

The infrastructure of an institution plays a vital role in the development of college as the students are now focusing on the quality of labs, classrooms and other required modern facilities while selecting a college.

The college accommodates more than 4000 students studying in UG, PG, Postgraduate Diploma and Ph. D Programmes. The campus is spread over 09 acres of land facilitates excellent infrastructure for teaching – learning process, career progression and higher education. The college have very good infrastructure with advanced classrooms and laboratories and have witnessed a remarkable growth in infrastructure development along with the academic developments that have taken place over the past few years especially in last two years. Computing resources are one of the important and mandatory needs of modern era and the college is now equipped with latest computer products and internet connectivity. The computers should be running all latest software products with necessary licenses so that all features of the product can be used by the students. The software should support the academic work of the students along with bringing out their extracurricular activities. Additional resources such as printers, wireless internet connectivity for use in laptops should also be provided by the college. The wireless internet connectivity should work well in all the locations of the college including class rooms, office, cafeteria, library, seminar halls, conference hall and everywhere on the campus. Only then you can access internet anywhere anytime to get updated about the latest happenings around the world.

The MMC has state-of-the-art infrastructure and learning resources including ICT enabled classrooms, Smart classrooms are getting popular now-a-days and the college have an eye over the technology so that the students are benefited. The teaching - learning process is supported by the adequate infrastructure of the Institution. 14 class rooms are ICT enabled. While the number of new infrastructural development has increased, the number of existing classrooms and seminar halls has been upgraded with new technology supported with ICT, LAN, LCDs, K-Yans, Smart Boards, CCTV Cameras, and Wi-Fi facilities. Equipment such as laptops, web cameras, printers, projectors, etc should be accessible for students and should be given to them according to their needs. Training for the use of ICT devices and Digital library should also be provided by the college to students regarding newly launched products and give them hands on training. This will give an edge over others when it comes to placement and higher studies.

Consequently, to meet the demand for greater supply of electricity, the college provides 24 X 7 alternate power supply that are maintained by Green Generators with DG Motors. The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled and all departments have Internet facility. The campus is fully covered under fire safety norms and several Fire Extinguishers have been installed for security and safety of all laboratories, computer labs, classrooms and at various places on the campus as required.

The Library recognizes the importance of functioning in a thoroughly professional way taking into consideration the interest of all departments. The Library is housed in the main building of the college with 100 seating capacity for reading purpose.

As a prime learning resource, the College Central Library namely '**Medha Knowledge Centre**' is fully automated with all its subsystems like LAN connectivity and Wi-Fi. Library Management Software system is incorporated with latest technologies that enables library to serves its users more effectively. Barcode online circulation system is in practice in the library. The library is a member of INFLIBNET. The digitalization of library through OPAC has resulted in the easy access of



information from any computer within the campus on subject / author- wise book, account information like books borrowed and due date to return, penalty to be paid, if not returned intime, and so on. It also facilities retrieval of information.

The MMC Central Library is well-stocked and has a wide collection of Books, Reference Books, Rare Books, Journals, Periodicals, Newspaper, Previous Year Question Papers, Photo coping facility, e-journals, Audio-Video Materials etc. A specialized service provided by the library includes INFLIBNET facility with Network Centre for access and download the e-resources with KOHA software and OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facility for searching the library resources. Central and departmental libraries have subscriptions of many national and international academic journals. The college library has linked with National Digital Library and OPAC helps the students to search the available reading materials easily. A special software is available in the Central Library for visually challenged students.

In collaboration with Central Govt. Scheme under (SECI) Solar Energy Corporation of India, a 100 KWp Solar Power Plant has been installed on the top roof of Main Administrative Building to generate electricity from renewable energy source which saves the 50% monthly electricity expenses of the institution and reduces environmental pollution. The science laboratories of all science departments, laboratories of computer department, language laboratory and e-library have undergone effective modernization of instruments and equipment not only to meet the current requirement of modern teaching -learning but with view to developing these infrastructural facilities through constant monitoring. These are maintained with keeping in view that these centres are the prime learning resource where various research works is carried out.

Our college has four well-furnished campus hostels, Students' Common Room, Students' Recess Lounge, Visitors' Lounge, Eight Water Coolers with RO-Kent Water Purifier, Sudha Milk Parlour, and well-equipped Students' Cafeteria with proper hygiene facility. Stationary- cum- Bookstore is available on the campus to facilitate students' requirements. Our college has also a utility corner where photocopying, lamination, scanning and online form submission facilities can be accessed on subsidized rates.

The infrastructure and learning resources are upgraded according to the need of students with qualitative and quantitative facilities for overall personality development of students. The Institution provides congenial environment for holistic development of students. Apart from academic facilities it also promotes co-curricular and extracurricular activities, such as:

### **SPORTS FACILITY**

- College has a spacious playground which is used by students to practice and play various outdoor games and sports
- Various sports events and group display events like Yoga, Aerobics and PT are organized on the occasion of Annual Sports
- Every year in the month of December Annual Sports Day has been organized with full zeal and zest
- The campus has Basketball Court for the students
- College has a spacious Indoor Stadium on the campus where various tournaments are organized round the year
- Gymnasium and yoga center of college is also a major attraction for students



### **CULTURAL STAGE & OPEN AUDITORIUM**

- College has a spacious Open Auditorium with projector and audio-visual facility where various cultural, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities have been organized regularly
- Students' Central Society and Sahodara- The House System of the college organizes various co-curricular events in the premises regularly
- Various important days are also celebrated under the banner of Sahodara Society
- Cash Scholarship, Awards and Certificates have been distributed to meritorious students and winners of different events on the occasion of Annual Day and College Foundation Day

### **FIRE SAFETY FACILITY**

- The fire safety devices have been installed throughout the premises, especially in all laboratories and cafeteria which are at high risk like Physics, Botany, Chemistry, Home Science and BCA Laboratories
- College also arranges Mock Drill for Earthquake and Fire Safety Drills from time to time to make students' aware, sensitize and prepare for any fire hazards.

### **SAFETY- SECURITY FACILITY**

- To ensure safety and security of teachers and students, Bihar Government has set all female Police Booth at the entrance of the College Main Gate
- To strengthen it further a number of CCTV cameras have been installed at various locations on the campus, classrooms, library, cafeteria, students' common room and main gate of the college

### **PROCEDURES FOR MAINTAINANCE OF INFRASTRUCTURE**

The college has a systematic and transparent system for maintenance of various facilities. All maintenance work has been done through tender system as per the standard norms. Institutional mechanisms for maintenance of infrastructure, facilities and equipment of the college are as follows:

#### **BUILDING INFRASTRUCTURE**

- As a constituent unit of Patna University, constant effort is made to provide secure space for equipments and tools. The college Building Committee looks after the maintenance, repair and constructional works inside the campus
- Construction, repair and maintenance of the building and physical infrastructure like water supply, power supply and gas supply are looked after by this committee
- For maintenance of civil and electrical works a college staff is assigned by the college authority to verify the work done by the contractors
- All works have been done through tender system as per the standard norms
- All minor faults have been taken care by hired technicians, carpenters, plumbers
- Maintenance of toilets and other service areas have been outsourced through outsourcing agencies as the norms prescribed by the university administration





## **MAINTENANCE OF FURNITURE**

As per the requirement of departments and office, carpenter has been hired to look after the maintenance and repair work of furniture, fixtures and other physical infrastructure. Work done has been verified by the designated staff.

## **MAINTENANCE OF LABORATORY EQUIPMENT**

- Each lab maintains a stock register of all the laboratory items
- Dead Stock Register is also maintained to keep an account of the non-functional equipment
- Equipments are checked elaborately on yearly basis. A committee of concerned unit is formed by the college administration which inspects and evaluates the current working condition and status of equipments. An inventory is managed at departmental level for maintenance of practical materials and is presented before the committee
- Consumable items are also categorized separately and checked by the committee members time to time. The committee members give its recommendations whether repair or upgradation is needed
- Departmental Council give requisitions for purchase of needed items after inviting quotations from different agencies which is then scrutinized by college Purchase Committee. After approval of the committee, required items have been purchased

## **MAINTENANCE OF LIBRARY**

- Departmental Council gives the list of books comprising author and publishers' names according to the need and demand of students. The list is presented to the college Library Committee for sorting and approval and college fulfil the demand according to the available fund
- For maintenance of books, library incharge teachers and non-teaching staff select damaged books for repairing, covering, hard binding or soft binding. For protection and maintenance of books vacuum cleaning and pest control has been done as a regular maintenance work

## **MAINTENANCE OF INDOOR SPORTS COMPLEX**

Sports committee looks after the requirement and facility related to Indoor and Outdoor sports and gives requisition to the college administration for purchasing and maintenance of sports items and maintenance of Indoor Complex

## **MAINTENANCE OF DIGITAL DEVICES**

- Annual maintenance and software upgradation have been done through pre-purchased offers when new computers have been installed to save funds
- Computers and ICT equipments which are not covered by this scheme are maintained by a separate requisition application as demanded by the departments
- New purchase and upgradation are recommended by departmental council, which are to be recommended and routed by concerned college committees and then items are purchased through open tender
- As per need of hour learning resources are upgraded time to time in the library

## 5. STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

Student's welfare is at the heart of our college vision, mission and governance. The Institution comprehensively plans and chalks various students' welfare programmes in the areas such as inclusive admission policies, quality infrastructural facilities, curricular, co-curricular, extracurricular and extension activities. The college provides scholarship for economically backward students under Government Scholarship Scheme and provides cash rewards as Merit Scholarship to university Gold Medalists and Rank Holders students through cheque. They are also helped by '**Earn While You Learn Programme**' where they are given opportunity to work on the campus after class hours.

Students are the reason and soul of the Institution so the college extends special support to students for rewarding future and aspiring career. Quality of education in the college is a democratically shared commitment and accountability among dedicated-sincere teachers, obedient- meritorious- dynamic students and vigilant - devoted parents. The teaching faculty work sincerely towards the overall personality development of students through organizing extra classes, career counseling classes, special classes for slow and advance learners, practical sessions, group discussions, seminars/ workshops/ guest lectures/ interactive sessions etc. The Institution is helping the students in their academic progression by providing various facilities like remedial classes, bridge courses and enrichment classes. The departments take remedial classes, where each and every student is given personal attention. Weak areas are being identified and corrective measures are taken accordingly. Department-wise motivational talks and counselling sessions are given to boost up the self-confidence of students.

The MMC administration is well aware of special needs of students' future. In this regard, several counselling sessions for higher education, entry level training, awareness programmes for CA, CS, IAS, MBA, Central/ State Services, Defence Services, NET/SLET is being conducted in routine manner under the aegis of Career Management and Counselling Cell (CMCC). The Career Guidance Cell provides opportunity to the students with training for Competitive and Civil Examinations, Soft Skill Training, Career Counselling, Campus Interviews, Job Placement etc. Various competitions are being organized for enhancing academic capabilities of students and they are encouraged to perform research work and present their papers through power point presentation.

The department of vocational courses – BBA BCA/ B. Com/ BSW encourage the faculty members of self-financing professional courses to interact with industry experts, recruiters, university experts and alumnae frequently to gain knowledge on the current needs of industry and market. The experts are also asked to evaluate the current teaching learning methodologies followed by the faculty. All these suggestions are considered while designing the curriculum of Certificate Courses run by the college.

Our college provides congenial environment for holistic development of students through various academic, cultural, co-curricular, extracurricular, extension and community service activities. Students are being motivated to participate in social responsibility activities like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan programmes, environment protection awareness programmes, blood donation programmes, health awareness programmes. etc. NSS and NCC units of the college organizes these Programmes.

The MMC publishes its updated Prospectus, Handbook, Jigyasa-the Research Journal, Annual Report and College Magazine annually which can also be accessed online. The **Prospectus** presents a



comprehensive view of the college, its history, vision-mission, rules and regulations, details of courses, course objectives, career prospects and admission procedures. The college provides '**Prospectus**' and **Handbook** to students for general information and also provides the college magazine **Aprajita**'. The college magazine '**Aprajita**' and '**Annual Report**' which annually publishes a detailed report of all activities conducted by different bodies of the college during the academic year. The college magazine highlights all activities of the year with photographs and the event calendar enlists the forthcoming events of different departments. The magazine contains the academic calendar displaying all important academic, co-curricular, extracurricular and extension activities. Besides the information about several activities it also covers special achievements of students as well as the scholarly articles of students and teachers. The same information is available on the College Website too, which has been updated regularly.

The MMC Research Journal '**Jigyasa**' is an academic journal on educational research and innovations reviewed by the peer group to encourage and promote the research work among undergraduate and postgraduate students in all disciplines. The journal contains original peer-review academic articles dealing with important issues of state/ national/ international relevance in educational research, innovations, theory, methodology and practice.

#### **THE STRUCTURAL -FUNCTIONAL FEATURES OF STUDENT SUPPORT & PROGRESSION - AT A GLANCE**

- **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):** The IQAC is a cell meant for creating, maintaining and enhancing quality in all spheres in the college for overall student support and progression. The IQAC is the central quality monitoring body of the Institution. It functions under the Chairmanship of Principal and comprises senior faculty members, representative from the local community and students' representative. Its aim is to develop and maintain a system to promote academic and administrative excellence. Our college facilitated regular meetings of IQAC and ensured that the IQAC is continuously engaged in promoting the self-evaluation of the Institution. For academic and administrative quality assurance, various activities are planned. At the beginning of each Academic Session, IQAC formulates objectives for quality improvement. The IQAC is authorized to monitor the preparation of the AQARs and to make suggestions for quality enhancement. To meet this end, the IQAC holds meeting on a regular basis. Students' mentoring, support and progression, opening of new programmes, upgradation of library, laboratories, classrooms, teaching techniques, infrastructure and increasing the effective functioning of all systems are some of the major concerns of the IQAC
- **Students' Participation in Administration:** The concept of students' participation in administration and governance is fully emphasized and practiced in the premises. Students actively participate in various academic and administrative works by becoming the elected members of such body like-IQAC, SQAC, Sports Committee, Common Room Committee, Students' Central Society, Science and IT Society, Sahodara, Society Green Earth Brigade Cell, Students' Grievance Redressal Cell, Sexual Harassment Cell, Anti -Ragging Cell, Environment Cell of the college. Their volunteer involvement can be witnessed at the time of seminar and admission serving from Helpdesk to help the admission seekers and guests



- **Student Mentoring and Support :** The MMC has a structured mentoring and support mechanism with Principal and Heads of the respective departments. Faculty members as mentors are assigned some groups for personalized attention and counselling. Students' profile, which indicate social, economic and academic background along with their sports and other special abilities and disabilities are the soul points of mentoring strategies for effective socio, psycho and academic guidance. Students are encouraged to meet their mentors frequently. Students voice, their requirements, grievances, opinions through their mentors discussed with their respective heads of the departments in the departmental meetings. The scope of mentoring goes beyond classroom support to equip the students with right knowledge, attitude and skill so that they successfully face the challenges ahead. The subject teachers give guidance and special coaching to students for university and competitive exams and all kind of entrance exams for future higher studies and recruitment
- **Students' Welfare Committee:** Principal, Bursar, Heads of the departments, senior faculty members and as students' representatives GS and AGS are the part of Students' Welfare Committee which takes care of the students' welfare on the campus
- **Students' Quality Assurance Cell (SQAC):** The Student Quality Assurance Cell comprising Principal, Bursar, IQAC Coordinator and Students' Representatives evaluates, monitors and finds strategies to proactively address student related matters like- facilities, maintenance, discipline etc. and works sincerely for overall quality development of students. The Cell meets frequently to discuss various academic and other student related issues. The Cell members take student grievances to the notice of the Principal, Coordinator and heads of the departments. The Cell plays a proactive role in resolving the general disciplinary issues among the students, and also in maintaining the culture and discipline on the campus. They are the liaison persons between administration and the students. Members of the SQAC identify the student volunteers from different classes to form an organizing committee to conduct programmes like seminars, guest lectures, workshops, cultural fest etc. They also play an active role in communicating important information to all the students. They actively render their services to various departmental club activities. The Cell in coordination with the various committee members organizes events like Induction Meet, Teachers Day, Freshet's Day, Farewell Day, College Day, Sawan Mahotsava, Garba Dance Competition, Winter Fest etc. College provides necessary funds for Cell initiatives
- **Students' Grievance Redressal Cell:** Grievances pertaining to students are redressed by the **Grievance Cell** which comprises Principal, Senior faculty members and Students' representatives. The Cell addresses the grievances of students and gives a patient hearing to the disputes of the students. Every fortnight, the suggestions / complaints received from the **Students' Suggestions Boxes** are collected and reviewed by the members of **SQAC** under the supervision of the Principal and members of Feedback Analysis Committee and necessary action is taken immediately. Grievances pertaining largely to amenities, campus discipline, teaching-learning, college timings, attendance, library and staff are redressed by the Cell and grievances pertaining to university examinations are routed to the Controller of Examinations, Patna University





- **Anti-Ragging Cell:** The Anti- Ragging Cell comprising the Principal as the Chairman and senior faculty as the other members takes ample measures to prevent ragging on the campus. The Cell sets up banners and also anti-ragging legal notifications on the College Notice Boards. The faculty orients the senior students into understanding the ethos of the college and thereby positively conditions them to proactively connect to the freshers. Strict anti-ragging instructions are given to the students through handbook and at the time of admission. A number of Anti-Ragging Hoardings have been displayed on the campus and inside the main building. On the day of Induction Meet and Orientation Sessions organized for newly admitted students the Principal and Resource Persons alerts the students about laws against ragging. Ragging is strictly prohibited on the campus and no serious instances of ragging have been reported on the campus so far
- **Sexual Harassment Cell:** The Sexual Harassment Cell of the college addresses the issues of sexual harassments and also alerts the students on the legal implications. The Cell on the campus conducts awareness camps to orient the students on how to be alert to the threats of sexual harassment; and the ways to defend themselves. However, there have been no reported incidents of sexual harassment on the campus
- **Students' Attendance:** The status of students' attendance is assessed on a daily basis and the same is communicated to the parents in departmental Parent-Teacher Meet. The head and faculty members of the department closely monitor students' attendance and display the status of attendance on the departmental notice board monthly. The Principal takes up the cases of students with acute shortage of attendance and meets the parents for counselling
- **Students' Feedback:** A comprehensive students' feedback is administered at the end of final exam and semester exam wherein the students answer varied questions on punctuality and performance of the teacher and objectivity in evaluation; syllabus, infrastructural facilities, co-curricular activities and support services etc. Class representatives who are the part of SQAC also bring about deliberations on students support services. Informal feedback regarding improvement of student support is also taken into consideration. The feedback is consolidated, analysed and discussed by the heads of the departments in the departmental meetings and also by the Principal in the HoD's meetings. The Principal, Coordinator IQAC and Students' Coordinator of SQAC discuss relevant issues with the respective in charges and thus rectify the drawbacks in the support services. Grievances and suggestions are also gathered from Suggestion Boxes setup within the easy access of the students, paving way for the betterment of student support services
- **Guidance and Counselling Centre:** Counselling services are made an integral part of the curricular framework of our college. Some qualified field expert counsellors are assigned to conduct classes on a wide range of topics that include Life skill, Communication Skill, Goal Setting, Mental Hygiene, Anger Management, Suicide Prevention Training etc. These sessions benefit the students as they learn efficient ways of dealing with adolescent confusion and various other challenges and difficult situations in life. Apart from these scheduled classes, students have one to one interaction with the counsellors after the class hours. The Centre provides a free, confidential personal/ professional counselling service to all students. The Centre also provides consultation to staff members, families and friends of the needy student. Our mission at the Counseling Center is to vitalize the mental and physical health of all the students, to improve their quality of life and create a learning environment that facilitates their individual development. All sessions are strictly confidential and any personal information is not revealed to anyone without the permission of students. The Centre provides total privacy to students who need guidance and counselling. All matters discussed are kept strictly confidential





- **Placement Cell:** The MMC has a vigilant ‘Placement Cell’, which arranges campus interviews, guest lectures and career counselling sessions to help the student to explore job opportunities in different industries through campus recruitment. Career guidance is provided to the students about various facets of interview techniques. Experts in the field of career counselling are invited to provide guidelines to aspiring job seekers. The college Placement Cell takes the responsibility of placing the students in reputed companies. All willing students are offered Pre-placement training and made employable. When recruiters visit the college for campus placements, the Placement Cell uses this opportunity to find out about the market trends and corporate expectations. Feedback on the performance of our graduates is taken from their employers, so as to assess and address the gaps that need to be filled in order to optimize students’ employability. Feedback from the employers also helps in identifying relevant skill and topics to be included in the Pre- placement training sessions
- **Role of Societies:** Athletic Society, Students’ Central Society, Sahodara Society and societies of various departments organize and encourage students’ participation in academic, co-curricular, extracurricular and extension activities. Our students have excelled in various sports and cultural events apart from outstanding academic achievements in the last years. Extracurricular activities are made an integral part of the students’ profile as the college is committed to its vision of promoting holistic development. The Principal together with the Heads of department holds monthly meetings with class representatives to discuss and plan the forthcoming extracurricular activities of the Institution. Efforts are made to see that most extracurricular activities are student centric to involve the students at all levels, that is from conception of the programme /activity to organization to execution and participation
- **Students’ Central Society:** The Students’ Central Society an elected body of students’ representatives is an integral part of college administration. It is also known as **Students’ Cabinet**. Election for different posts like, General Secretary, Assistant General Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Sports Secretary, Sanitation Secretary, Science and IT-Secretary, Green Earth Brigade Secretary, Environment Secretary and Treasurer is held every year in the month of January. Students of all programs of B. A /B.Sc. and B. Com/ BBA/ BCA/ BSW Part I and Part II are its voters. Elected members look after the various fields such as Discipline, Sanitation, Environment, Cultural, Sports/ Science and IT activities and contribute to the smooth functioning of the system by their coordination and efficient work culture. It is a prestigious opportunity given to students to create an atmosphere of harmony and coordination in the day-to-day multi-dimensional growth and performance of the college. Students’ Central Society organizes a number of academic and extracurricular activities throughout the academic session
- **Sahodara Society:** The MMC has liberty to be proud of having first introducing ‘House System’ in colleges in Bihar, by the name ‘**Sahodara-The Daughter of Same Mother**’ which coordinates with Students’ Central Society to organize various competitions at different level. There are four houses: **Jagriti, Maitri, Pragati and Samriddhi**. The House Captains/ Vice Captains are coordinate with Students’ Central Society. All competitions are held in the college under the umbrella of these Houses. The winners get points according to their positions and performances. At the end of the year, the points are calculated and the house with maximum points is declared the winner for the year



- **Soft Skills Development:** Soft Skills development being a major area in promoting global competencies. College regularly conducts workshops/seminars/guest lectures on interpersonal skill goal setting, team work, presentation skill, corporate skill, decision making, etc. Eminent resource persons are invited for motivational talks on personality development, communication skill and soft skill development. Apart from this a few inter-disciplinary and certificate course lay a strong foundation in numerical aptitude which is a prerequisite for various competitive examinations. The curriculum of English is also designed to include soft skill, communication skill and employability skill
- **English Language Lab:** Our college has a well-developed English Language Lab for soft skill development with Internet facility and it is available to all students. The said Lab has special software of English language to improve English-speaking skill. For promotion of soft skill, the college has three months English Language Proficiency Certificate Course for all students
- **German Language Proficiency Course:** In the light of benefits of foreign language for shaping the future of students the college has a German Language Proficiency Certificate Course. It is an elementary course in German language of three months duration (Level-I). Once a student clears Level-I she will be eligible for Level-II, which is also of three months duration. After complexation of both levels, students will be issued a Certificate of Merit. This course has gained popularity among students aspiring for global career
- **Smart Classes for Smart Generation:** The importance of Smart Classes has added a new dimension to teaching and learning process, making it more effective. Through visual classes students tend to have a better understanding of the subjects and find it easier to memorize. It has helped in achieving optimum results
- **CCCA:** Department of BCA organizes short term 45 days Certificate Course in Computer Applications (CCCA) for students and it is mandatory for the students of all conventional courses so that their IT skill could be enhanced before leaving the college
- **Special Coaching:** ‘Remedial Classes’ and extra classes are conducted regularly by the departments for slow learners to improve their learning. The departments for the same to improve their learning also arrange class tests frequently. Enrichment classes are conducted for advance learners. Skill enhancement programs, inter-college competitions, seminars, project works, group discussion classes, mock interviews are conducted to enhance employability. Various books for competitive examinations, journals and encyclopedia are available in the library for the needy students. Career guidance is given to all students by the faculty as well as by guest lecturers. Various departments like Botany, Political Science, Psychology, BCA and Economics provide books to students from departmental libraries
- **Govt. Scholarship for Students:** As per the rules of Bihar Government the college provides free education to students and encourages SC/ST and OBC students to apply for scholarships provided by the government. **50%** of the students have received financial assistance under reserved category from State Government and Central Government. Students are made aware of the available scholarships /procedures of application through circulars and notice boards



- **Publication of Student News Bulletin:** The Students' News Bulletin titled '**Mimansa**' is published quarterly. It includes complete illustrated information on curricular, extracurricular, co-curricular and extension activities of the college during the year. It highlights the achievements of institution, faculty and students, in addition to providing placements information
- **Study Tours:** The departments arrange study tours for students particularly in Botany, Zoology, Physics BBA, BCA, B. Com and Economics to make them familiar with various institutes, industries, natural habitats and their working requirements and available current technology. The students also take part at State/National level Seminars/Conferences organized by the Institution and other institutions of higher learning. The alumnae who are placed in different industries help students in providing exposure and training
- **Multi-Dimensional Personality Grooming Classes:** To make students compassionate human beings and not mere bookworms, the Institution has adopted multi-dimensional techniques that focus on personality grooming and overall development of students. Leaving behind the age-old customary teaching techniques the departments have now resorted to grading system to maintain equality among students and give them a chance to improve by realizing their potential
- **Alumnae Association:** The Institution has registered active Alumnae Association '**Manishika**' through which various activities like awareness programmes, training programmes, personality development sessions have been organized regularly with the Motto: '**Reunite, Renew, Reflect**' and the expenditure is managed by the college alumnae association. The association fosters a strong sense of community and tradition; promotes lifelong learning, enriches the personal, professional and cultural lives of our alumnae and acts as a support service to the college

#### **Activities/ Contributions of the Alumnae:**

- Being members of statutory bodies like IQAC, SQAC, Advisory Body, they give valuable inputs to make development of relevant aspects
- Alumnae interact with the current batch of students to offer valuable insights about corporate culture, corporate expectations, organizational functioning and challenges faced in work situations
- Visit the college to give guest lectures on career guidance and personality grooming
- Alumnae also help in identifying placements and internship opportunities for present students in the organizations where they are working
- Help in organizing management events, industrial visits and important NGOs visit
- Offer valuable feedback to the Institution about the relevance of curriculum and need of infrastructural development
- Alumnae donate books to general library
- **Alumnae Feedback:** The mechanism of gathering feedback from various sources is effectively channelized for the growth and overall development of students as well as the Institution. The Institution maintains its alumnae network through Annual Alumnae Meet, their visits to the college and college website. Feedback of alumnae is sought on the relevance of curriculum to the needs of the industries and the suggestions are considered while designing and revision of curriculum, inter-disciplinary courses, certificate courses, internships and projects. The alumnae representatives on the regulatory bodies like the IQAC, SQAC and Advisory Body make significant contributions to the proceedings on the



curriculum design of college certificate courses and development. The college also follows the practices of obtaining feedback from freshly graduated students at the exit level to address issues related to course work, teaching practices and other student support services. Feedback/suggestions from graduates pursuing higher studies at premier institutions in India and Abroad are obtained to promote effective vertical mobility

- **Parent-Teacher Meet:** The MMC organizes department-wise Parent-Teacher Meet twice in an academic session. The departments received constructive and valuable advices and feedback through the parents / guardians which are very useful for the holistic development of Institution as well as students.
- **Parent-Teacher Association:** Our college has a strong and active 'Parent-Teacher Association'. Several workshops and counselling sessions have been organized under the aegis of this association
- **Incubation Centre:** An Incubation Centre with the mission to 'facilitate fertile platform to develop entrepreneurs from its talent pool' has been established in the college on 15th May 2018. The main functions of Incubation Centre are:
  - Orientation of a students for taking up entrepreneurship
  - Training and skilling the one who are interested in this direction
  - Holding business ideas competitions to develop innovative ideas
  - Preparing business plan of those ideas by the budding entrepreneurs
  - Connecting the idea to Startup Policy of Government of Bihar and India, Mudra Yojana, Angel funding, Venture Capitalists etc.
  - Creating connections with industries in collaborations with prominent state, national and international industry bodies like Bihar Industries Association, CII, National HRD Network etc.
  - Providing Work Stations to the Startups
  - Training, Mentoring and Hand holding of the Startups by a pool of human resource in the form of Incubation Council comprising of successful entrepreneurs, management consultants-chartered accountant etc.
  - Expansion of the facilities of Incubation Centre by getting financial support from
    - ❖ Government of Bihar
    - ❖ Corporate Houses
    - ❖ Successful Entrepreneurs
    - ❖ Organizing high impact seminars and conferences for entrepreneurs by the support of leading business bodies and NGOs
  - The vision of Incubation Centre is churn out a pool of successful entrepreneurs in the ecosystem of Bihar and thereby contribute in the development of the state

For medical health care of students, college has a MOU with Red Cross Society, which is next to the door of the college building where students can receive immediate treatment whenever they needed

## 6. GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

The Institution follows a democratic and participatory mode of governance with all stakeholders participating actively in its administration. The IQAC, Heads of Departments, Coordinators of Self-financing Courses, Conveners of various Committees and Cells along with the staff representatives on higher decision-making bodies play an important role in determining the institutional policies and implementing the same.

The institutional administration is participatory in nature and decentralized in its working. The Heads of the department and the senior faculty members are involved in decision-making at various levels. The Institution is always open to discussion with the teaching and non-teaching staff which, in turn, encourages the involvement of the staff for the improvement of effectiveness and efficiency of the institutional process.

The MMC is known for value-based education besides covering the prescribed university syllabus; it has also been inculcating human values among the students through personality development classes. The vision, mission, core values and strength of the college explain the value-based education system for holistic development of students to compete with global challenges and contribute to national development by perceiving human values.

The mission statement provides a backdrop or perspective to all the activities such as classroom teaching, practicum, research work, field action projects, extension work and co-curricular activities. Through various academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, as reported in IQAC reports from time to time, the mission of the Institution is implemented with utmost care. It provides the highest quality of value-based education both at undergraduate as well as postgraduate classes.

The Institution has put together an excellent combination of human resource and physical infrastructure for imparting high-quality education. Its faculty members are well qualified and committed, its library is well stocked, and its physical infrastructure is world class. It lays equal importance on to all aspects of quality education, namely theory-practical classes, extension activities and research. The teaching faculty is the real strength of the Institution. The work efficacy of the teaching faculty is developed through participating in seminars, workshops, orientation Programmes related to ICT bases teaching-learning and quality enhancement Programmes.

The litmus test of the excellence of any institution is discipline. To maintain discipline, derivation and implementation of the rules-regulations, code of conduct, policies are of paramount importation. The Principal as the head of the Institution along with its team (faculty members, non-teaching & administrative staff) derive and enforce all such rules, ethics and administrative decisions and also reserves the right to change them as and when required. The Institution has three tier organization setups headed by the Principal. Finance-cum-Development Committee looking after the development and management policies of the college, Advisory Committee and various Committees providing effective leadership in decision making under guidance of Patna University, UGC and the Government. The Students 'Grievance Redressal Cell and various Cells looking after the grievances of students, teaching, non-teaching staff maintains discipline on the campus. The management through outsourcing process recruited competent and accountable class III and class IV adhoc staff.





Physically challenged individuals are given equal weightages in recruitments. Self-appraisal reports of permanent faculty members are considered for the promotion and annual increments.

Principal conducts regular meetings with the academic and non-academic staff and their suggestions are taken into consideration. IQAC meetings with administration, Development Committee, Advisory Committee, Placement Cell, SQAC and Internal Examinations Committee members are regularly conducted for review and improvement. The HoD's conducts the departmental meetings with the teaching staff focusing on improving the academics, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The college groom's leadership among the faculty members by giving them opportunities to work as heads of various committees in IQAC, academic, curricular and co-curricular activities.

The Institution has a perspective plan for development. Institution prepares proposals for development assistance from UGC and Government. The Institution also prepares perspective plan every year with reference to academic programmes, field action projects and also infrastructure improvements. While taking decisions regarding budget formulation, infrastructure development, faculty recruitment, faculty development, research, national and international linkages, workload, and academic activities etc., the perspective plan is treated as the guiding principle.

The Institution organized various workshops and seminars from time to time as well as encouraged the staff to attend seminars, workshops and training programmes organized by other organizations at local to international levels to enhance their professional development. The Institution also encouraged the faculty to contribute to the development of the profession by way of writing books, presentation of research-based papers and undertake research.

All Faculty members are encouraged to involve themselves in field action projects. The faculty was given duty leave to participate in refresher courses, orientation courses, for taking part in consultancy services to other organizations, and to attend seminars, workshops and training programmes. As a policy, the Institution never refuses permission to faculty to attend such activities aimed at for their professional development.

There has been an upward development of the Institution in different areas like the conduct of many seminars and workshops; improvement in infrastructure; consistently good results and high pass percentage of the students; a very low percentage of dropouts; no grievances reported to the Grievance Redressal Cell; high percentage of students' attendance and active involvement in field work, including co-curricular and extracurricular activities.

Frame work for quality assurance has included collaborative perspective hence various academic activities in collaboration with external organizations are undertaken. Environmental issues and current social issues are included in the integrated framework. The Institution promotes a participatory approach with involvement of teaching and non-teaching staff at all levels. The Institution has a well-developed mechanism for collection and analysis of students' feedback. The collected feedback is analysed by the IQAC, and its findings were submitted to the Principal.

The Prospectus and the website are two main channels for communicating, quality assurance policies and mechanisms of the Institution to the stakeholders. The AQAR communicates with an external



stakeholder like NAAC. The in-house news bulletin communicates about the quality outcomes to the internal stakeholders.

The Institution prepares annual budgets of each of its activities. While preparing the budgets, care is taken to ensure the availability of financial resources and to ensure that the resources are allocated for optimum impact. These budget estimates are scrutinized by the College Finance-cum- Development Committee, which finally gives its approval.

To ensure integrity in the ecosystem, audit of process is must. The college has internal and external audit system maintaining the good performance. Academic, Green, Energy, Water and Administrative audit is conducted by internal committee to maintain transparency, hygiene and cleanliness on the campus and to enhance the performance of the students and the staff members.

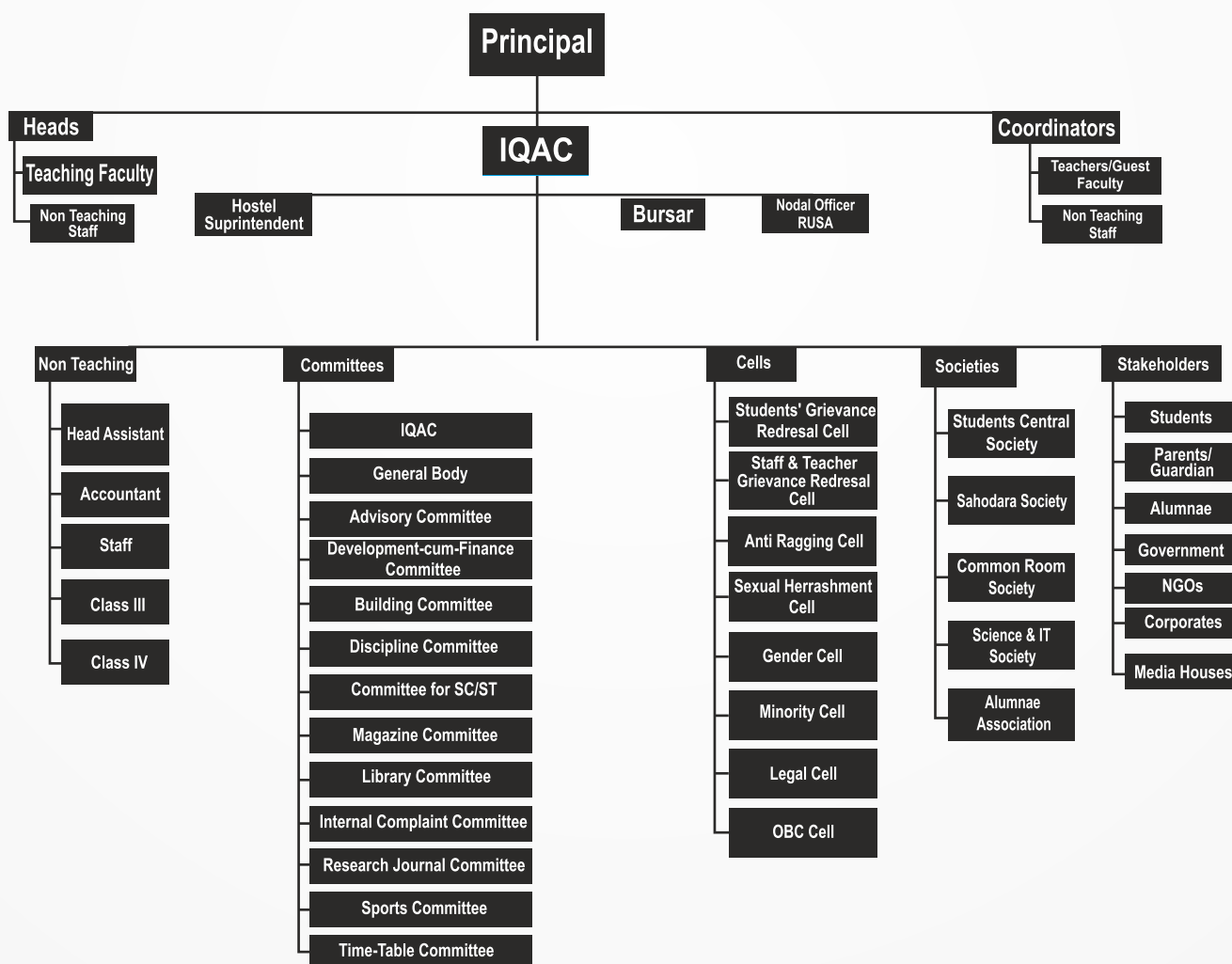
## ORGANOGRAM

## 7. INSTITUTIONAL VALUES AND BEST PRACTICES

The Institution shows concern in the environmental issues and guide students through awareness programmes towards plantation, making plastic free campus and also advices students to use bicycles rather than bikes at least once in a week. The institution also believes in conserving energy; hence the college is equipped with LED bulbs and solar water heaters. Waste management system is in practice. For solid wastes, disposable bins are used whereas liquid waste is managed by underground drainage system.

For providing healthy environment and quality life to the students, college maintains three 'R's' concept-Reduce, Reuse and Recycle to manage solid, liquid and e-waste. College maintains polythene free green practice within the campus through various measures. Our college is strongly committed to sustainable development through its mechanisms of environmental management in accordance with many of the schemes employed at college campus. The college further develops social, environmental and ecological sustainability. College has its own functional 'Environment Policy' to guide its ongoing improvements in the environmental concerns of the institution.

The green earth and ecofriendly environment are the requirement of our present and future generation. So, it has been truly conceptualized in practice and plan here and that too has been injected in the behavior of the thoughts of all stakeholders. The institution has taken several measures for planting to make Green Campus. A bigger part of total area is covered with trees and lawns. A number of trees exist at different places on the campus. **Aquarium** in the premises is a suitable reservoir of different species of fishes. Fishes look attractive due to their body colors and feathery fins. It also increases the aesthetic appeal of the place. Fishes, swimming in group indicate a sense of social and community ecology.

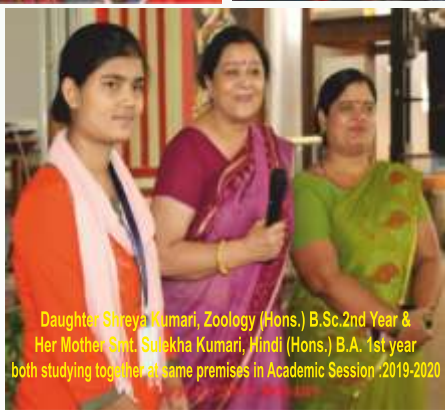

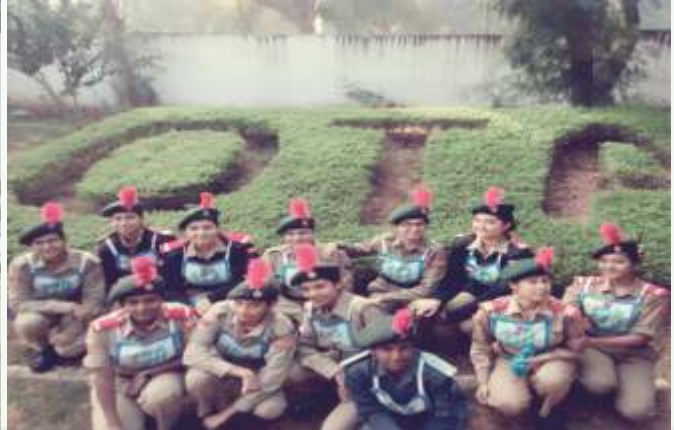
